

Deity worship @ home — Syllabus

ISKCON Deity Worship Ministry is delighted to welcome you to the Deity Worship @ Home online course.

By establishing a relationship with the Lord through His deity we can easily reawaken our dormant Krishna consciousness. By learning how to do the rituals of deity worship and understanding their function and purpose, we can easily develop our loving relationship with the Lord.

Course description

The course duration is six weeks.

Each week there are weekly assignments, discussion board posts, assigned readings, online quizzes, etc.

At the end of each week there is a live, interactive session which will include online discussion debriefs, Q & A sessions, and procedure tutorials.

This in-depth training covers the knowledge, skills and values required for the daily worship of deities in your home and introduces you to concepts that are applicable both in the home worship environment as well as the temple.

A Facebook account is required for participation in this course. The private Deity Worship @ Home course Facebook group is the hub for course interaction, assignments, quizzes, discussion forums, and is exclusively viewable only by registered students and facilitators.

The live session times will vary according to location and will last approximately 60-90 minutes and will be hosted on Zoom.

- This course covers all the basic knowledge, skills and values required for the daily worship of deities in your home.
- There is a balance between the theory and practical aspects of deity worship in your home.
- This course introduces you to concepts that are applicable both in the home worship environment as well as the temple.
- The necessity of cleanliness will be explored as well as the transcendental nature of the deity,
- Each week will cover different aspects of deity worship practices and philosophy and will build upon the prior sessions.

Assessment overview

- There will also be assignments where participants are required to read passages and post comments in the appropriate unit in the Facebook group.
- Additionally, you are required to upload videos of yourself doing various tasks.
- Assignments are expected to be completed and submitted before the start of the next session. The final date for submission of all assignments is the last day of March 2021
