



Deity worship @ home — Syllabus

ISKCON Deity Worship Ministry is delighted to welcome you to the Deity Worship @ Home online course.

By establishing a relationship with the Lord through the deity we can easily reawaken our dormant Kṛṣṇa consciousness. By learning how to do the rituals of deity worship and understanding their function and purpose, we can more easily develop our loving relationship with the Lord.

Course description

This in-depth training covers the knowledge, skills and values required for the daily worship of deities in your home and introduces you to concepts that are applicable both in the home worship environment as well as the temple.

Each week there are weekly assignments, discussion board posts, assigned readings, online quizzes, etc.

The course duration is six weeks.

At the end of each week there is a live, interactive session which will include online discussion debriefs, Q & A sessions, and procedure tutorials.

The live session times will vary according to location and will last approximately 60-90 minutes and will be hosted on Zoom.

- This course covers all the basic knowledge, skills and values required for the daily worship of deities in your home.
- There is a balance between the theory and practical aspects of deity worship in your home.
- This course introduces you to concepts that are applicable both in the home worship environment as well as the temple.
- The necessity of cleanliness will be explored as well as the transcendental nature of the deity,
- Each week will cover different aspects of deity worship practices and philosophy and will build upon the prior sessions.

A Facebook account is required for participation in this course. The private Deity Worship @ Home course Facebook group is the hub for course interaction, assignments, quizzes, discussion forums, and is exclusively viewable only by registered students and facilitators.

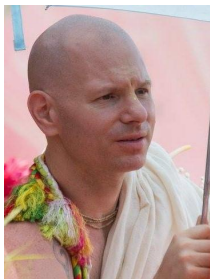
Rasa devī dāsi

Assessment overview

Topic assignments

Each week there will be a variety of topics covered. Most topics will have short assignments that will average about 1 to 2 hours each week. Here is a quick overview of the types of assignments given:

- Reading from Śrīla Prabhupāda’s books and answering simple single-choice, multiple-choice, or matrix quizzes.
- Reading and commenting on posts in the appropriate Guide in the Facebook group.
- Additionally, you are required to upload videos of yourself doing various tasks.

The topic assignments are due by the end of each week, before the weekly live session begins.

The final date for submission of all assignments is the last day of July 2021.

Weekly assessment

At the end of each week, there will be a summative assessment that focuses on the big ideas of the previous week and mainly serves as a revision exercise.

This quiz is designed to be completed in no more than 20–30 minutes.

The weekly assessment will be available on the morning of the last day of each week.

I.e. At the end of Week 1 the weekly assessment will be available on the morning of the 27th of June, etc.

Assignments and coursework will be weighted as follows:

End of week quizzes	30%
Forum quizzes and questions	30%
Ācamana video	10%
Ghee wick making video	10%
Food offering video	10%
Arati video	10%
TOTAL	100%

Course policies

- Each week you are required to attend an online session. There are two sessions each week. Choose whichever session suits your timezone. You will also have access to recordings of each session, which will be available in the Facebook group shortly after the live session finishes.
- Assignments are due before the start of the weekly live session. All coursework, assignments, etc. must be submitted no later than 31 July, 2021. No assignments will be accepted after this date.
- Facebook group content and recorded sessions are accessible until 31 August, 2021.
- Facilitators are making themselves available to students at the designated times, but appointments are necessary.
